

## Facilities and Services Available to Students with Disabilities

Each institution must make available to prospective and enrolled students information about facilities and services available to students with disabilities include students with intellectual disabilities (as defined in 34 CFR 668.231).

Olivet Nazarene University is proactive in meeting the needs of students with disabilities. Students with disabilities who have been deemed “otherwise qualified” and admitted to the University may be eligible for tutors, note takers, extended time on exams, or assistive technology as per recommendations for services. All students admitted to the University have both building and program access.

In the 2014-2015 school year 66 students with disabilities received services. Because some students had multiple disabilities, the Learning Support Services office approved services for 75 categories of disability as per the following table.

Students with disabilities are responsible for submitting appropriate documentation of disability. Documentation from a psychiatrist, licensed clinical psychologist, medical doctor or school district Individualized Educational Plan (IEP) is acceptable.

Services for students with disabilities are delivered through the Learning Development Center. The Learning Development Center provides reasonable accommodations for students with documented disabilities. As per policy, students who have disabilities may be eligible for peer tutors, note takers, testing accommodations and/or use of assistive technology. This year, the LDC provided accommodations for 50 students with disabilities in the fall semester and 37 in the spring semester.

Accommodations for students with disabilities are designated by the Director of Assessment and Learning Support Services, by course. Individual students may receive multiple accommodations. The Kurzweil reader is used for students who need assistive technology when testing.
